Effective Compacts:

- ★ Focus on student learning skills
- ★ Summarize how teachers will help students develop those skills using high quality instruction
- ★ Share strategies parents can use at home
- ★ Explain how teachers and parents will communicate about student progress
- ★ Describe opportunities for parents to volunteer and participate at school

Our Goals for Student Achievement

District Goals

Our District Improvement Plan outlines goals and measurable objectives for the entire district. Those measurable objectives for student achievement are:

- ★ Increase the number of students reading at or above grade level as indicated by their Lexile level.
- ★ Increase the percentage of students scoring proficient or higher on the Georgia Milestones.
- ★ Increase the graduation rate of the 4-Year Cohort annually.
- ★ Increase parent participation at school events.
- ★ Decrease the number of student absences each year.
- ★ Decrease the percentage of student discipline referrals in each school each year.

Wilcox Elementary School

WCES administrators and teachers have studied our student performance data to decide on the most important areas of improvement for our school during this school year.

- ★ Increase the number of students performing at or above grade level in math fluency and concept application as determined by universal screeners given three times during the school year.
- ★ Increase the number of students meeting or exceeding their expected grade level Lexile range as determined by the Reading Inventory Assessment given three times during the school year.
- ★ Using Success Criteria posted in the classrooms and documented in lesson plans, school staff will continue to provide feedback to students on their performance on the standards and/or learning targets to empower students to take ownership and monitor their own progress.
- ★ WCES will continue their positive behavior reward system to promote a safe and healthy environment for students to learn.

WCES teachers will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key connections will be:

- ★ Promote a positive learning environment
- ★ Communicate frequently with parents regarding students' progress
- ★ Establish cooperative learning groups that enhance students' learning
- ★ Adding 30 minutes each day for intervention/extension time.
